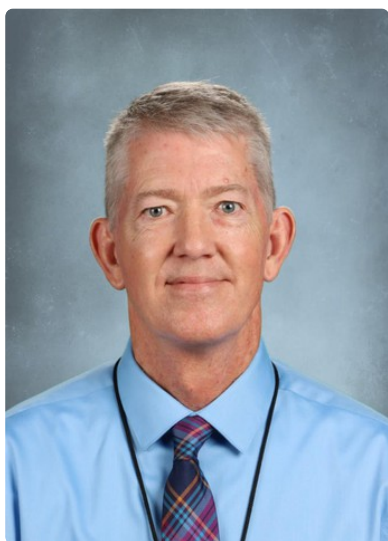

Dear VES Families,
